

# Glasgow district in top 10 statewide

GLASGOW —The Glasgow Independent Schools District has made the top 10.

Administrators learned Tuesday night the district has been ranked No. 10 in performance out of 174 school districts in the state.

**Lisa Stone, a representative of Kentucky Association of School Councils (KASC)**, in partnership with Kentucky School Boards Association (KSBA), also said the high school ranked 21st out of 214 high schools and the middle school ranked 24th of 222 middle schools. Highland and South Green elementaries performed in the top 25 percent of the 715 elementary schools in the state.

**Stone served as the facilitator for a Partnership for Student Achievement training session.**

“It is good to know that others recognize that we rank as a top 10 school district in the state of Kentucky,” Superintendent Kathy Goff said.

“I feel that we have built stronger relationships with all of our stakeholders and everyone has an interest in our academic performance for all levels,” she said. “We are now ready to prioritize our goals for the district and develop school and district improvement plans that will take more students to the proficiency level.”

Board member LaDonna Rogers said the rankings showed the true commitment to the students of Glasgow schools.

Board chairman Jerry Ream added his support of the training programs educators are participating in to help achieve proficiency goals.

**“I feel this training provided a unique means for our district administrators to map a plan of action** that will assist our faculty and students in their learning experience and in turn boost our district toward the achievement goals set for the year 2014,” he said.
