1 Tests: During the Interim Period, current tests with MC/OR items based on current Core Content continues; new NRT added beginning 2009-2010.

2 Arts/Humanities and Practical Living: Districts will receive a copy of a test and scoring guides . Tests are optional and at the district's discretion.

3 Writing Portfolio: Scoring for state data collection and reporting is cancelled; scoring for local use is at the discretion of local district.

4 Writing Portfolio Training Sessions: Attendance required until SB 1 is signed into law; once in law, attendance becomes optional; local district decision.

5 Test Window: Districts have chosen their dates of testing in April/May 2009 and the dates remain the same.

6 Testing Schedule : Within the Test Window, schools/districts will choose 7 days for testing with 3 additional days for make-ups. Details will be sent.

7 Alternate Assessments: Schools will not administer some Attainment Tasks (Practical Living/Vocational Studies and Arts and Humanities grade 11).

8 Accountability for Title I Schools: During the Interim Period, Title 1 schools will continue all aspects of the federal No Child Left Behind Act.

9 Accountability for Non-Title I Schools: During the Interim Period, Non-Title I schools will not fall under federal consequences; however, non-Title I schools not meeting AYP will be identified for state assistance and support.

10 Textbook Adoption: Mathematics textbook purchases may be delayed until after the new mathematics standards have been revised.

11 New Standards: Revisions on the new state academic standards will start in spring 2009. Date of completion for all standards: December 2010.

12 Program Reviews/Reporting: Will be developed during the interim period for Arts/Humanities, Practical Living/Vocational Studies, and Writing Portfolios.

¹ CRT/NRT combined : a criterion-referenced test will be combined with a norm-referenced test based on new state content standards; the test will be a single common test with multiple-choice and constructed response items.

2 Test Window: Test Window will be within last fourteen days of a district's calendar.

3 Testing Schedule within the Window: Test will be given in a 5-day period with additional days for make-ups.

4 Federal Accountability: Title I schools will be held accountable under the No Child Left Behind requirements.

5 State Accountability: The KY Board of Education will determine the components of the state accountability system.

6 New Standards: New state academic standards will be developed and used for the new state assessment system.
