## **SOME TOP 2006 DISAGGREGATED RESULTS**

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FREE & REDUCED LUNCH STUDENTS  
AFRICAN-AMERICAN STUDENTS  
STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES

*This is a report from the Kentucky Association of School Councils on the schools we see as having the strongest results for three groups: students who participate in the free and reduced lunch program, African-American students, and students with disabilities.*

The data...

We obtained the numbers from the Kentucky Department of Education. KDE publishes an Academic Index for each group at a school—except that it does not provide data if the school had fewer than 10 students in that group in one or more tested grades. KDE also provided the data on the number of students tested and the percent of students in each group at each school.

Beyond the data...

Each of these percentages represents individual children, and each of these scores stands for the achievement of those children. The smaller the gap numbers, the fewer children falling behind. That is a worthy goal, and through this report, we at KASC applaud the work of teachers across the state who are striving toward that goal.
